Coaching

- A number of new APMHA coaches in 2024/25:
 - In particular at the U7 and U9 age groups.
 - Coordination and monitoring of coach certification requirements Smoother process this year having access to the HEO portal to validate certification history.
 - VSC process via the OPP portal was problematic (took upwards of 2) months in some cases for VSC's to be processed) – Issue not unique to APMHA but proactive measures should be taken heading into next season.

Season Summary (cont'd)

Player Development

Skating Clinics:

September sessions – Each age group received 1 hour of organized instruction with "Rise n Grind Hockey" (in addition to standard conditioning ice sessions with coaches).

Goalie Clinics:

- A total of 20 hours of ice time was dedicated to clinic sessions over the season led again by Patrick Killeen.
- Over 90% participation rate (including 10+ goalies per session at the U9-13 age groups).

- 2024/2025 was similar to last year in terms of revenue and registration.
- 2024/2025 Our Home Tournaments generated roughly \$10,171.00 this year.
- APMHA lottery raised \$23,600.00 used to offset registration for members and \$4,200.00 was given back by way of raffle winners.
- ▲ APMHA net profit for 2024/2025 was just over \$26,000.00.
- U7 registration increased by \$1,540.00. Not as much as last year but still showing an increase in registrations.

Summary of Events & Clubwear Report 2024-2025 Season

Clubwear Sales

- This is the second season where all orders that were fulfilled through Gilks Signs & Promo were made online except for any special orders that were not available on the website.
- Hats, game socks, and helmet stickers were sold at APMHA Day. Most of the stock was sold.
- All orders and special orders were made for Gilks to process before Christmas. This will be the same process next season.



Clubwear Sales (cont'd)

- Game socks (JOG & Athletic Knit) were and still will be available throughout the seasons. This season every team made 1 big order and will continue to do this process next season.
- Various items for teams were ordered through Gilks such as Name Bars, Practice jerseys, Pins, and end of season gifts etc.
- Payments that were not made online through Gilks were made via email transfer. We successfully added the Square this season for card payments on APMHA Day.

APMHA Day

- Held at the Almonte Arena in October.
- Team photos took place.
- Clubwear sales took place using the Square for payment.
- A few teams used the day as fundraising opportunities.



APMHA Awards Banquet

- Held at the Pakenham Arena this season in March.
- Added fun prizes to the awards this season.
- Despite the bad weather, both Junior and Senior Banquets ran smoothly.

U7 Summary

- 65 skaters, 16 coaches, 4 trainers, 4 managers and 4 teams
- 14 returning and 6 new coaches / 3 coaches moving up
- 1 Director, 1 Head Coach
- 4 new managers
- ✓ Players were split into 4 equal sized teams based on a two practice sort out.
- Each team competed in 2 fun days and the Timbit's jamboree at the CTC. Team Red played during an Ottawa Senators intermission.



U7 Summary (cont'd)

- Team Gold Youngest and least experienced
- Team White Mostly 1st and 2nd year players
- Team Black 2nd and 3rd year players
- Team Red Mostly 3rd year and most experienced players
- This format will work going forward to organize teams, practice plans, jerseys, etc.
- 2021-22 Season = 49 skaters, 13 coaches, 0 managers, no teams (covid)
- 2022-23 Season = 48 skaters, 14 coaches, 3 managers, 3 teams
- 2023-24 Season = 56 skaters, 15 coaches, 1 manager, 3 teams
- 2024-25 Season = 65 skaters, 20 coaches, 4 managers, 4 teams
- Overall Increase = 32% skaters, 54% coaches, 33% -40% managers



U7 Recommendations

The more coaches the better

This year we had to turn away coaches due to the team sizes.

Hopefully this interest and enthusiasm continues into the future.

Host a coaching clinic before or near the beginning of the season

This has all coaches on the same page. Communication and teamwork is key and once everyone knew what was to be expected, things ran smoothly.

Better division of duties

Going forward, a better structure of who creates practice plans, who oversees coach and player development and who organizes team involvement.

U7 Recommendations (cont'd)

- **Book fundays as early as possible**
 - Returning managers will have a head start on the season to book fun days in our area.
- Looking ahead for more available ice time
 - With the rapid growth of the U7 program and the expansion in housing developments in Almonte, additional ice time will be needed as the program continues.



Ice Scheduler: J-F Meloche



Ice Scheduler Report 2024-2025 Season

Summary

- All round good start to the season with having gained more experience again last year as ice scheduler.
- Transition to scheduling with SportsHeadz on our end was relatively smooth. Nice, simple platform for me to use.
- League was a little slower posting games due to the new app so unfortunately the early season practice schedule was also delayed.
- The idea once again this season was to have one game and two half ice practices per week when permitted. Older age groups had one full ice practice per week to better suit player obligations outside of hockey.
- Permanently added two extra U7 ice times this season due to the high enrolment rate.

Summary (cont'd)

- ▲ APMHA Held 45 hours of conditioning between U9 and U18 groups.
 - 4 of those hours were dedicated for Goalie clinics.
 - 8 of those hours were run by Rise & Grind Hockey.
- APMHA Held 36 hours of Sort outs & Evaluations between U9 and U18 groups.
 - 2 of those hours were dedicated to Goalie evaluations.
- APMHA successfully held 16 Goalie Clinics in total during the season, 8 for U9-U11 and 8 for U13-U18 groups.
- APMHA was also able to run 4 successful 2-day tournaments.
- To my knowledge, there were no scheduling issues once again this season with any games. Only a few practice ice times may have been lost due to conflicts.

Ice Schedule Summary

- In all, APMHA had over 800 Ice times during 2024-2025 Season broken down between the Almonte and Pakenham rinks.
- 364 of those ice times were in Pakenham, with the remaining 483 in Almonte.
- APMHA was able to return 29 hours of ice to Township this season that wasn't needed. Costs to be removed from our seasonal contract.
- APMHA did have to purchase 10 extra hours of ice from CP for this season's playoffs due to our ice being removed week of finals.

- Continue to learn and improve my knowledge of the scheduler role while taking notes of what works and what doesn't work when it comes to scheduling pre-season, regular season and playoff ice scheduling.
- Continue to explore and learn the SportsHeadz platform and see what it has to offer.
- Continue to communicate with Coaches, Managers and Executive members to improve everyone's better understanding of how the scheduling process works.
- Create a contact list of coaches and managers to better facilitate communications each team.



Plans for 2025-2026 Season (cont'd)

- ✓ Plan to once again have all teams inform me of Tournament/ Jamboree Registrations by a "TBD" cut-off date to help facilitate overall ice scheduling during the season. Idea is to avoid last minute schedule changes due to teams being away.
- Continue to work on a document to better prepare the next volunteer who will one day take on the role.
- Look at ideas to use end of season practice ice for something other than just practices for teams out of the playoffs.
- Look to perhaps secure another hour per week if needed for growing U7 group.

Equipment Report 2024-2025 Season

Equipment Summary

- Start of 2024-2025 went well.
 - Pinnies were sorted and ready for first sort outs.
 - Jerseys were sorted and ready prior to season start.
 - Coaching gear was ready with kits of pucks, cones and first aid kits.
- At no cost to the organization, we were able to get new first aid kits and a large amount of pucks for teams and now have extras.



Equipment Summary (cont'd)

- In total, 12 teams suited up for the beginning of season with minimal jersey swapping needed.
- Still had the usual Youth Large and Youth XL spare jerseys at the locker with a few Adult XL and Goalie Jerseys.
- Currently organizing the return of jersey bags, along with first aid kits, pucks and cones handed out this year to inventory.
- Will be going through all jerseys to determine their condition. Small repairs will be done in house to avoid any costs. Anything major will need to be discussed.



Goalie Equipment

- Currently still have goalie equipment to fit players from U7 up to U13.
- U7 now has dedicated goalie equipment. Equipment for goalies were lent out to one U9 team with some additional goalie gear given out at U11. Still quite a few extra pieces of gear were available in various sizes at the locker if needed. (Pads, Blockers, Catchers, Chest protectors).
- Coaches and trainers reached out this season when looking for items, especially goalie equipment which was great to see.



Plans for 2025-2026 Season

- Continue to work on a simple system to help oversee, track, maintain and control the APMHA equipment assets in inventory.
- Continue to clean up the current inventory.
- Major summer clean-up of locker, several members of APMHA have offered to assist.
- Inspect goalie equipment and jerseys.
- Inspect each coach kit/crate and upgrade items as needed.
- Acquire more pucks (blue) and other equipment for U7.




Summary

It is essential to obtain approval from the Director of Coaching before registering for a course. This pre-approval process allows the organization to verify the courses' relevance and alignment with district level certification requirements and coaching development goals. All receipts for approved courses must be submitted to the Director of Coaching within the current hockey season in order to be eligible for a reimbursement.
